Seek Medical Attention

Seek medical attention and advise your provider that you were injured on the job.



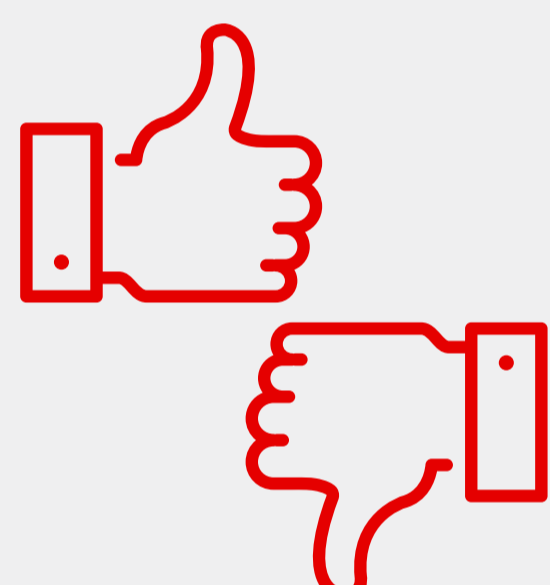
Report the Injury

Report the injury to your employer.



File a Claim Form

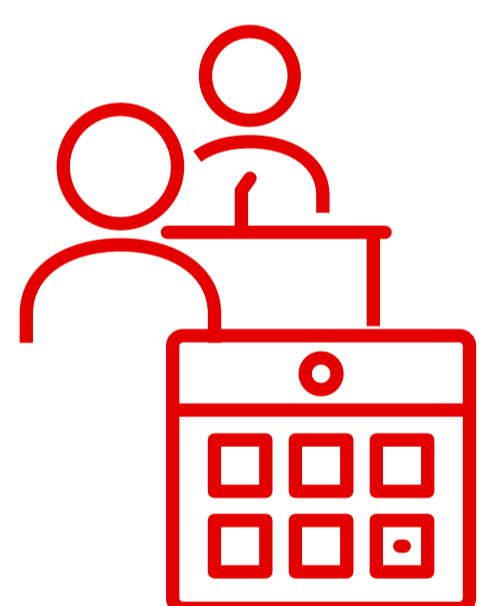
File a Claim Form with the NYS Workers' Compensation Board.



The Claim is Accepted or Denied

The insurance carrier may accept or deny the claim.

- If accepted, you are entitled to medical benefits and lost wage payments.
- If denied, you will have to wait for a Law Judge to issue a decision in your claim.



Dispute? Request Further Action

If there is any dispute over medical treatment or proper payments, a Request for Further Action form can be filed to schedule a hearing.



Judge's Determination

Once Maximum Medical Improvement is reached, a Judge may determine your permanent impairment.

- You may be entitled to a Schedule Loss of Use award or payments for your Loss of Wage Earning Capacity.
- A settlement may be negotiated in some instances to completely resolve your claim.
